What is the purpose of the Study:

The Ground Ambulance Cost and Rate Setting Study is designed to gather detailed information on the financial landscape of ground ambulance services in New Hampshire. The study will:

- Assess Costs
- Evaluate Paid Claims
- Develop a Rate Schedule
- Support Legislation



Legislative Mandate for this Study:

In accordance with <u>Senate Bill 407</u>, a law that was passed by the New Hampshire legislature this spring, the primary goal of this study is to accurately assess the financial landscape of Licensed EMS Units in New Hampshire. The data collected will be used to develop a fair and sustainable reimbursement model that reflects the true costs of providing these essential services.

This will done by developing a rate schedule based off the data collected from Licensed EMS Units and Town Managers



The initial letter was emailed out on August 27th from the NHID The letter contained an overview and the purpose of the study and a call to action to fill out the <u>Profile Survey</u>



Step 2: Data Request:

If your department completed GADCS:

- You will receive a request to submit your GADCS instrument on September 4th with a due date of September 11th
- 2. If you have access to your instrument, you will upload it to the survey
- 3. If you do not have access to your instrument, you will email <u>ambulancedatacollection@cms.hhs.gov</u> to request a copy
 - In your request you will include your NPI number and request to obtain a copy by September 9th
 - Instructions to request GADCS Instrument from CMS

Data collected from Licensed EMS Units will be aggregated and analyzed, to be presented to stakeholders and legislators in a final report format – no individual EMS unit-level data will be shared.

Step 2: Data Request:

If your department did not complete the GADCS Instrument

- You may be selected to submit additional data on September 4th with a due date of September 11th
- 2. Data that will be requested will include Expenditures, Depreciation Schedule, Billing Data, Transport Data
- 3. Data Resource guide will be posted to the NHHP Website which includes additional information
- 4. September 9th Open Forum will discuss the data in more detail

Why should I participate in this study?



Participation is required from providers being asked to participate in this study. The study's findings will inform future legislation and policy decisions to ensure that ambulance services are adequately reimbursed and sustainably funded, ultimately benefiting both providers and patients. The commissioner of the department of safety shall have authority to enforce this reporting requirement upon ground ambulance providers under the general supervision and specific enforcement authority conferred by RSA 153-A.





What is a NPI Number?
